With the help of trusted community partners that believe in the power of healing through art, Awakenings has been able to exhibit this collection in a variety of public spaces. The artwork not only acts as a powerful educational tool for those interested in learning more about the emotional impact of sexual violence, but, more importantly, acts as inspiration for survivors to heal through art themselves.







"I've found such beauty in this kind of parallel about life, about people, about suffering, about all the victims of all cruel circumstances, that sometimes in life we all live under the pressure, in such hard suffering that could be similar to something closed and squeezed like there is no air to breathe, no space to move on, and trapped by someone, somewhere, suffocated and alone...

The paintings closed inside the plastic bags are like a metaphor for those who talk about the silence of the victims, but a helping hand can always relieve that pain when you take each of these paintings trapped and give them a hug, a lap, love!"




